General requirements.

- The final deadline to submit your abstract is March 31 2022 11:59 PM Argentina Time (GMT -3).
- Abstracts can be submitted without filling the registration form and before full payment. Once the abstract is accepted, the fee must be paid.
- All abstracts will be published on the conference's program and will be reprinted.
- The Scientific Committee expects to announce the decisions by April 15, 2022.
- The organization reserves the right of rejecting abstracts for publication in the conference's program if they fail to meet the guidelines.

Guidelines to the making of abstracts for proposals of oral presentations and posters.

- Every abstract must be written using a single line spacing. The font must be Arial 12, with the categories "Introduction, Material and Methods, Results and Conclusions" in Arial 12 in bold.
- They can only be submitted in electronic format, in Spanish or English.
- They must be submitted in the following link: https://bit.ly/3MoPJKk
- The maximum abstract length is 500 words.
- The title of the abstract must include the first letter of the first and middle names and the full last name of each author.
- The presenting author must be listed as the first author.
- The registration data belonging to the authorsmust appear immediately after the name of each author.
- The use of abbreviations is not suggested. Place special or unusual abbreviations in parentheses after the entire word or phrase the first time the abbreviation appears.

Abstract topics.

We focus in three subjects:

- Prevention of perinatal deaths (PPD)
- Perinatal bereavement care (PBC)
- Intrauterine death (ID)

PPD The purpose of this topic is to share successful strategies or research for PPD. This could include topics such as relevant studies during pregnancy, performing autopsies to find out the cause of death and avoid it in future pregnancies, the experiences of parents and doctors with the management of certain pathologies related to perinatal death, including questions of pregnancy after the loss.

PBC The purpose of this topic is to share knowledge related to an improvement in PBC. This could include experiences or research related to an early accompaniment of the mourning process, the need for a farewell space, the humanization of the doctor-patient relationship, and the experiences of parents and doctors regarding the best practices of PBC.

ID The purpose of this subject is to share new concepts, research and knowledge about ID. This could include topics such as the scientific basis of ID, the epidemiology and pathology of ID, including placental pathology, as well as the experiences of parents and clinicians with ID, including issues of bereavement and their interactions with bereavement systems. of health.



Types of presentations.

Oral: Individual or grupal

- A single oral presenter delivers his/her presentation to a large audience. Un único presentador oral expone su ponencia para una nutrida concurrencia en forma de conferencia. Pairs of two presenters can be made but they must distribute the presentation time.
- The time for individual oral presentations will be 15 minutes with an additional 5 minutes for questions.
- Additional instructions about abstract submission will be provided at the time of abstract acceptance.
- Abstracts should include the research methodology and results in detail to allow reviewers to rate the scientific merit of the research.
- Abstract not containing these aspects will not be accepted.
- The Scientific Committee reserves the right to accept the presentation in the form of a poster and/or written presentation in lieu of an oral presentation.

Poster

Poster sessions will be held in a virtual space specially designed so that participants can get to know the results of the research and interact with the authors. This presentation format should not be confused with an oral session. The information about the size of the poster and the details of the accompanying written description will be sent to the authors after they have accepted abstracts. Design specifications will be sent as well.



Tips for writing abstracts.

What is an abstract?

- A concise piece of writing on the main elements of the research or project that is presented.
- A summary that allows reviewers to assess the quality of your work in order to be presented at the conference.
- A summary document intended to entice the reader to want to know more about your reasearch or project.

Tips for writing a good abstract

- Follow the format and suggested guidelines in the website.
- Be clear and concise. Provide only the necessary information to reach the conclusions.
- Present results. (do not communicate that results will be discussed in another forum).
